

Search Spell check for Magento 2

User Guide



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1. Search Spell check Configuration

Once you are finished with installing the extension it is time to proceed to your Magento 2 backend to finalize the Search Spell check setup.

We suggest running through the Search Spell check settings and other options available to adjust the Search Spell check. This will help in better understanding of how the extension functions and what can you expect your stores to look and feel like.

1.1.1 General – Enable Extension and Fallback

To configure Search Spell check extension, go to **Stores - Configuration – Ulmod Extensions – Search Spell check**

Set the **Enable spell check** option to 'Yes' to enable the spell check or to 'No' to disable this functionality.

If you have a 'Nokia' products in your catalog. Customer searches by misspelled search phrase 'Nokoa phone'. Default Magento search will return no results because there is no 'Nokoa phone'. With the Spell check option enabled, customer, will be notified about spelling error and see results by corrected search phrase 'Nokia phone'.

Set the **Enable fallback search** option to 'Yes' to returns results as part of the search phrase, if no products are found for full search phrase or to 'No' to disable this functionality.

If customers search by search phrase 'blue Nokia phone'. The store does not have such products and defaults Magento search will return no results. With fallback search enabled, the customer will be notified about and receive results by search phrase 'nokia phone'.

Note: reindex all indexers and clean cache before testing in the storefront.

1.1.2. General – Find and Replace

Enable replace words – Set to “Yes” to enable the find and replace words or “No” to disable this functionality

Enable replace words
[store view]

Yes

Adds the word(s) to find and replace in the search query

Please, use the “Add” button to add the word(s) to find and replace in the search query. Separated by space if more than one. Eg. If Find word(s) => '**bags mani**', and Replace with => '**shirt jack**'. Customers will have the search result for '**shirt jack**' if they search for '**bags mani**' in the storefront.

This allows customizing the search query for a better result.

Note : reindex all indexers and clean cache before testing in the storefront.
